Korumburra Horticultural Society

As I write we are in between heat waves and have had virtually no rain for over a month. This is not good for gardens. My poor garden is suffering, except for the vegies which are watered religiously. We are now knee deep in zucchinis and beans and the onions have been excellent. The beans freeze easily and are an excellent vegie for beginners, as all you have to do is provide something for them to climb up, plant the seed and jump back.

Zucchinis are even easier as they don't need a climbing frame and I usually buy seedlings. They make great bread and butter pickles, go well in cakes and savoury slices, and those that hide when you are checking the plants could probably be hollowed out and used as boats.

The tomatoes are not doing so well, but the spuds are soldiering on.

On the club front, we have decided to forego the March meeting in favour of a trip to the **Roval Botanic Gardens in Cranbourne.** Members will car pool and spend the day down there. The following meeting we have a tentative booking of a guest speaker. This gentleman took part in building the Australian garden that won the gold medal at Chelsea last year. There are also trips coming up to Tesselaars and Cloudehill garden and nursery at Olinda with the Poowong club, and to the Melbourne Flower & Garden Show with the Leongatha club. Many thanks to those who organise these lovely days out. For those who haven't seen Cloudehill, this is a garden that would hold its own with any garden worldwide. It is open to the public and the two Japanese maples alone are worth the visit.

Various members have particular horticultural interests. Our president, for example, is a very well known **brugmansia breeder**. Every year he grows hundreds of these spectacular plants, then has to cull most of them as they don't fit into his breeding program. I think he is trying to breed one that is self weeding and bakes cakes. As a result, many of our members now have gardens that contain at



least one of these gorgeous, perfumed plants, and as his fame (or should that be notoriety?) spreads, so the brugmansias spread over Gippsland. Recently he sent several to Traralgon gardeners after giving a talk over there. Happily, he can be bribed with homemade cake, especially fruit cake and melting moments.

Summer is on the wane and gardeners can look forward to the soft golden afternoons of autumn. Time to dead head flowers that have finished, and a little feed won't go astray, especially for roses, to set them up for the autumn flush.

In the meantime, watch out for the **beautiful crepe myrtles** flowering. These shrubs are lovely all year, with autumn colour, summer flowers, fresh green in spring and, best of all, their lovely smooth mottled bark that is exposed in winter. They are very tough and easy to grow and you can find a size and colour to fit in any garden.

There are so many easy to grow plants that beginning gardeners can plant, and information is readily available. Nursery owners are very knowledgeable and, in my experience, are only too happy to assist customers. Garden clubs are also good places to start.

The Korumburra Horticultural Society meets on the first Tuesday of every month at Coal Creek at 1.30 pm (there are exceptions, see above). Visitors are always welcome. The secretary can be reached, when not in the garden, on 5655 2565. Happy gardening.

"The Bureau ran out of cards quite early because they were so popular," said longtime volunteer Jill Widmer, adding, "We must order more next year!"

The Christmas card sales made by the Bureau provided numerous charities with extra cash from their Christmas card

Leongatha Centrelink & Medicare Agent kept busy

The Leongatha Centrelink Agent (which operates from 9.00 am to 1.00 pm each weekday, excluding public holidays) has been handling Medicare matters for nine months.

Clients may use the phone and computer to do Medicare business or have the friendly staff download forms and information.

"People still like to deal with a real person," said Bev Ellwood, Centrelink and Medicare coordinator for the bureau.

"They can access many Centrelink services on the net, but many prefer to deal with the agency," she said.

Many Centrelink customers are not aware that there is a Centrelink Agent in Leongatha. catalogues. Thanks to the perseverance of the bureau's volunteer Jill Widmer with help from Jessica Taylor the sales again pulled in money to supplement the charities' own card initiatives.

In all more than \$1700 was collected on behalf of six worthwhile charities: Arthritis Victoria, Anglicare, the Cancer Council, Royal Flying Doctor Service, Children First Foundation and the Lort Smith Animal Hospital.

"These services have been established in the local community to ensure that people can access Centrelink easily and close to home," said Ms Ellwood.

"Although Centrelink Agents do not have system access, they can provide information on payments and services, and help with forms and claim lodgement.

"Agent staff can even sight and photocopy Centrelink Proof of Identity documents, which can save a lot of travel time.

"Centrelink Agents can also refer you to Centrelink staff (including specialists) if you require further support."

The branch is located in the Memorial Hall complex in Michael Place, up the stairs opposite the rear part of the post office.

HAPI to run two groups in Korumburra

Gippsland Southern Health Service has continued to expand its highly successful HAPI (Healthy Ageing and Prevention of Injury) program by commencing a second group in Korumburra on Tuesday mornings. This addition to our groups will not only allow for new clients to join us, but will provide additional opportunities for existing members to undertake this valuable exercise program.

By providing exercises that assist in increasing flexibility, maintaining core strength and enhancing balance, the HAPI program is designed to assist clients in being able to remain healthier and happier at home.

People are eligible to participate if they are living independently in their home and are:-

- Frail and/or able bodied older people;
- People with an intellectual and/or physical disability;
- People with an acquired brain injury (ABI);
- Carers of these people.

Our classes are run by trained and registered exercise practitioners, and are designed to promote general health and well being, plus help to reduce risk of falls in older people – all while having fun in an enjoyable and social environment. HAPI features low impact resistance training, light weights and a combination of weightbearing and chair based exercise, to help clients build on their fitness and stay active and happy. Our groups run in a variety of locations at different times throughout South Gippsland. Classes run for 45 minutes and conclude with a cuppa, morning/afternoon tea and a friendly chat.

SOMETHING FOR KORUMBURRA TO BE PROUD OF

The following article has recently come to light at the Historical Society, and members thought that Korumburra residents would be interested to see it. It comes from 1944.

MacQueen Family Create Shire Record – Seven Sons – Seven Fighters, Six A.I.F., One R.A.A.F.

Seven sons, all in the forces, six in the A.I.F., one in the R.A.A.F. That is the proud record of Mr. and Mrs. Lachie MacQueen, of Korumburra. Of the seven, three hold Commissions, while three are N.C.O.s. Three are Prisoners of War, one in Germany, two in Malaya and all of them volunteered for overseas service. Shire President Cr. Bryson, has issued a challenge to any town in Victoria to beat this record.

Mr. and Mrs. MacQueen were, on Wednesday last, invited to the Council luncheon, but Mrs. MacQueen, unfortunately being ill, was unable to be present. Mr. MacQueen however attended and received congratulations upon having such a gallant family. Cr. Bryson expressed regret at the inability of Mrs. MacQueen to be present. He said the MacQueen family had been outstanding citizens of the town. When war broke out the sons immediately volunteered. These men were not just mere

soldiers for they quickly rose and now three of them hold Officer's Commissions and three are N.C.O.s. Seventh and youngest son was in the R.A.A.F. This boy is a very sore boy because his parents refused permission for him to join the air crew. The parents view was that as six sons had been in the firing line, three being prisoners of war, they wanted to maintain some hold on their youngest. So of the six, two were prisoners in Malaya, one in Germany. Three were in the Middle East campaigns. two in Malava, one in New Guinea. This was a Shire record, probably a State and probably an Australian record, both for quantity and quality (applause). Mr. and Mrs. MacQueen had many anxious moments but it was the wish of all that the family would someday be reunited again.

Incidentally the parents were to be congratulated upon bringing up the boys with the right spirit. The old Scotch Highland spirit lived in them judging by their names – Wallace, Douglas, Bruce, Kenneth, Campbell, Colin and Carlyle. In conclusion Cr. Bryson said he was proud to be able to show in some small way appreciation for such a fine family.

Quite amazingly, and wonderfully, the seven all returned to live out their lives in Australia. MacQueen Avenue was named in honour of the family.






