Korumburra Historical Society - celebrating 50 years

The **first meeting** of the Korumburra Shire Historical Society took place on 14th September 1966 in the old Korumburra Council Chambers' meeting room and continued there until the Historical Society moved to their present site when the Library was relocated to the former Shire Offices.

There are two Honorary Life Members of the Historical Society: Brian Blake, who was the first Secretary and is still an active member today, as well as Music teacher, Daisy Hardwick. She joined the Society in 1968 and was actively interested until she died in 1979, aged 94 years.

The vast - and growing - collection of historical records and other memorabilia has had many homes. Storage went from the original Shire Offices to the old picture theatre, then to the vestry of the church at Coal Creek before settling in the current well-resourced premises of the Historical Society.

Historical Society members are looking forward to celebrating the 50th anniversary of the organisation.

To mark the occasion, Lambis Englezos AO will speak at an afternoon function on 11th September at the Showground Amenities Complex, commencing at 1.30 pm. Cost for entry is \$10.00. Mr. Englezos was involved in finding the burial place of a number of men listed as missing after the Battle of Fromelles. He subsequently worked with the families of those missing men, and has been able to identify remains and have those interred in the cemetery at Pheasant Wood. His is a thoroughly engaging telling of events surrounding this episode.

The opening of **Macqueen's Barber's Shop** at Coal Creek was a recent highlight for members of the descendants of Lachie Macqueen, and very rewarding for members of the society who had given so much energy to bringing the project to a wonderful conclusion.

Mrs Dorothy Giles will speak to those who gather for the meeting on **1st September**. Dorothy will speak about the Gannon family and their vast involvement in the publication of newspapers (covering five generations since the late 1800s). All are welcome to attend, with the meeting to commence at 8 pm.

On **6th October** we will hear more from **Cam Macqueen's interview with Doug Boston** talking about the various Korumburra businesses in the times that he could remember.

The annual meeting of the society will be on **Thursday 3rd. November** at 8.00 pm and will include more taped memories.

Korumburra Tug of War Club

The Korumburra Tug of War Club was founded in 1997 and registered with the National Association, contesting many events not only around Gippsland but on the National stage also, winning several titles along the way. In 2000 the K'burra team travelled to England to represent Australia, gaining 8th on the World stage.

Currently two of our members are training and will participate with the national team at the 2016 World Championships being held in Sweden in September.

"On time, in budget and expected to be operational early in 2017".

This is exciting news for Korumburra. The new Children's Centre is large, light and airy and will incorporate a full range of children's services under one roof.

Jan Martin, the Shire Council's Director Corporate & Community was very impressed (and we should be too) with the \$100,000 community contribution from the Korumburra Kindergarten and Biralee Childcare Centre, spearheaded by Rebecca Marriott and Bronwyn Beach. She feels this is a true demonstration of the community's commitment to the project and was a significant factor in gaining grants from the Federal and State Governments (\$1.6M each) and the Shire Council (\$2.05M).

The Centre will provide 120 places for child care, kindergarten, out of school hours care, maternal and childhood services and specialist services and also provide opportunities for childhood educators as a training facility. It will be energy neutral with 10 solar panels, water capture facilities and cross-flow ventilation for summer.

Sally Baker, the Shire Council's Co-ordinator of Children and Family Services, emphasised the all-inclusive advantages of the Centre. All who come to the Centre will enter by the one door and have access to these "wrap around services". Mothers will be able to attend the Maternal and Child Health Nurse at the same time as dropping off children to the long day care or kinder sections.

There is a large area set aside for both undercover and outdoors play with a vegetable garden as one of the proposed projects.

Korumburra's children should get off to a good start in life with the help of the Karmai Community Children's Centre.

What's in a Name?

Coade Street, Korumburra was named after Sapper John Coade, baptized as "Issac David Coade" a son of John (Senior) and Mary Coade. A decorated soldier, John Coade received the Military Medal in the 1st World War.

He was born in Malmsbury in July 1878 where he was a gold and coal miner before enlisting and was in the Second Australian Tunneling Company. He was killed in action on 9th April, 1918.

John Coade's family lived in Mine Road and it was reported in the Great Southern Advocate on 20th May 1920 that a daughter, Gladys Coade, received very good marks at Korumburra High School. There was also a son Richard. They then moved to New Zealand.

Coade street is located off Mine Road and you will notice the poppy on the street sign. Poppies are displayed on roads named after families containing members who were soldiers, sailors, airmen or nurses who served in war.



Korumburra Horticultural Society

Because we are in central Queensland at the time of writing this I will imagine what is happening in the Spring gardens of Korumburra and surrounding areas. It has been a wet winter so



things are likely to be a bit slower in coming on. Nevertheless, bulbs such as Daffodils and Jonquils will be on display and perennial shrubs will be starting to put on this year's growth.

Now is the time to start your planting out. I prefer to wait until October before planting annuals because our block is quite damp and I don't want them drowned before they can get a start. But in any sunny drier spots you can have your choice from a large variety in punnets from local suppliers to plant out now.

You could also try growing from seed. It is quite easy with a bit of care. Most seed packets will have instructions which generally advise planting them in seed trays or punnets in seed



raising mixture. Keep them in a warm place but away from direct sunlight, except perhaps early in the mornings. Some seaweed fertiliser, applied at the recommended rate, can help them get started. Keep them damp and plant out when they are big enough.

If you are lucky enough to have a veggie garden, your Broad Beans should be starting to produce about now. Many people screw up their noses when Broadies are mentioned. It is most probably because, when they ate them in the past,



they were a bit old and tasted bitter. Try them when they are young. It is quite different. Mind you, that applies to most vegetables. Young and fresh, straight from the garden beats shopbought hands down. That's why we grow them isn't it?

The Korumburra Horticultural Society meets at 1.30pm on the first Tuesday of each month in the meeting room at Coal Creek. During spring we will have experts along to inform us about growing African Violets and give tips on veggie growing. We will also celebrate Cup Day at one of our member's homes. Visitors are welcome.

Grow Lightly Food Hub

Have you heard about the Grow Lightly Food Hub just on the outskirts of Coal Creek Heritage Park?

Three days a week you can buy fresh produce grown or processed locally. There are vegies and fruit for starters. But we now have dairy produce (milk, cream, cheeses) directly from the farm in Bass, yoghurt from near Warragul, specialty cheeses from Prom Country Cheese in Moyarra, oil from Fish Creek, sourdough bread from Ruby and Mardan, honey from Fishers of

Dumbalk, macadamia nuts and walnuts, freshly milled flour, peanut butter, organic free-range eggs, crisp pickled asparagus, jams and preserves and much more.

If there is surplus produce at the end of the weekend a great team converts these into jams, pickles, chutneys and other preserves, including dried fruit pieces and fruit leather.

Grow Lightly is run by volunteers and is managed as a not-for-profit company with a board. We are proud to serve only produce that is grown within 50kms of Korumburra. The only exception is organic, fair trade coffee coming directly from a growers cooperative in Ethiopia. You can enjoy a cup of coffee or a Madam Flavour tea whenever the shop is open -

Friday 10 - 4, Saturday 10 - 3 and Sunday 10 - 1.

If you find it difficult to get to Korumburra during shop opening hours and would like to have your vegies and fruit come already bundled we have a family pack of produce available once a week. It can be picked up at the Grow Lightly Food Hub, Silkstone Road, just near Coal Creek;

or if you live further away there are other pickup points available.

Arawata Landcare

Now would be the time to be proactive in the management of weeds on your property, predominantly blackberry and ragwort (pictured right), however prunus, watsonia, ivy, hawthorn and capeweed etc should also be dealt with.



Many new landholders in the

district are not aware of their legal responsibilities in regard to noxious weed control and come under the CALP Act - the cost to the farming community can be enormous. Non-resident-owner properties present a more protracted effort to ensure the property is maintained and meets community standards.

Remember to follow the specifications on the chemical guide and this time of the year you may even use less as a slow kill will be far more effective, especially with capeweed.


