Korumburra Rotary Club


Getting back in to our regular face to face meetings has been an enjoyable time for Rotary members, with a social chat and a meal together. We are however always seeking new members to join our productive little

Top of the Town - some site history

With renewed interest in 33 Bridge Street, we thought we would tell you more about the history of the building, which Janet Wilson gathered.

1888 The land was purchased at the towns very first Land Auctions by William Nuttall.

The Temperance Hotel, a two storey structure was built by the land owner 1892 William Nuttall.

The 3 devastating fires in 1898, two in January and a third in February. The Temperance Hotel was damaged and then completely destroyed. In fact five buildings along the street were destroyed.

33 Bridge was rebuilt, Duncan N Robertson was in the replacement building on this site, until his death in 1945.

William Fisher, founder of Fishers Timberyard, ironically replaced the wooden building with the current brick building, where he operated a hardware & joinery business. The second hand bricks came from the engine house and chimney of the defunct Austral Coal Mine.

Korumburra Horticultural Society

The Horticultural Society is currently going through a transition period. After over a year without meetings we have recommenced and had two meetings this year, back to monthly get togethers on the first Tuesday of the month. Our first meeting was at our usual venue at Coal Creek, the second at a members home, as the council is not giving us access to Coal Creek again.

We are aiming now to be a less formal organisation, while retaining our affiliation to the Victorian Horticulture Society and our connection to all the regional groups. At present we have no venue in which to meet, although some groups have made contact and offered us premises, and that was greatly appreciated.

Although meetings ceased due to covid gardening continued, and the difficulty people experienced in obtaining plants from their usual sources indicates just how many people all over Australia turned to their gardens during lockdown.

Autumn is a great season to plant, before the ground is cold but after some rain when the soil is moist and workable, and the heat is not a factor. An added bonus is that in fertile Gippsland we have enough rain to allow gardeners to stop watering. Bulb planting time is almost done but in my garden this year the daffodils are already up. This may create difficulties later in the year for flower shows in early spring. There is even one very confused bearded iris in full bloom in my back yard, and friends are seeing the same thing in their gardens. It will be interesting to see what those irises do in spring. The camellias, however, have bloomed on time and are looking lovely all over town.

Winter is almost with us, and rose pruning will need to be done. This year I am going to prune early and hope we dont get frost on new growth. Fingers crossed.

The tomatoes have come out, and the sweet peas are in.Mr Glenn, who owns and runs Lambley nursery at Ascot, has reminded us that its time to plant poppy seed. There is always something to look forward to in a garden, and always weeds to pull.

We hope to be in a settled venue soon, and then resume our usual timetable, and we look forward to welcoming new members.

Hi all, what's happening in your orchid house? A lot of your orchids should have initiated flower spikes by now, particularly your cymbidiums, the tall flowering varieties will benefit from staking, the smaller pendulous types should be allowed to grow as they are, just give them space to develop, give them a weak liquid feed once a week and DON'T forget the snail/slug bait.


The new season will start at the beginning of September. We welcome new faces any time. Why don't you come and try croquet? You might be pleasantly surprised.






