# TAX HELP IS BACK!

The South Gippsland Citizens Advice Bureau in Leongatha can help wage earners with their tax returns. The service is absolutely free and confidential, and approved by the Australian Tax Office.

Tax Help runs on Tuesdays until the end of October. "There has been some uncertainty about our service this year because of COVID, but it's all systems go," said Nicholas Peck, the Bureau's Tax Help coordinator.

We will assist clients to lodge their return, and it doesn't matter if they're confused about lodging electronically; we will help them regardless. Lodging is better than putting it off; it just gets more difficult later.

To make an appointment, just ring the Bureau Monday to Friday between 10am and 1pm (0356 622 111) to arrange a time, or you can drop in and arrange it in person.

The South Gippsland Citizens Advice Bureau is opposite the post office in the Memorial Hall complex, Michael Place, Leongatha.

# Media article for August 2021

Term 3 started well, but once again lockdown reared its ugly head and students had to return to remote learning. Then just as quickly they were back at school with everyone following COVID restrictions! Well done to students and staff for their resilience.

Whilst the students were in lockdown they were set a challenge by our PE teacher, Mrs Snooks, to trek around Victoria. Many families embraced the challenge, counting their kilometres as they walked, ran or cycled for their daily exercise. A total of 2,391km was covered.

## **South Gippsland Permaculture Network**

This Network is a newly formed group of like minded locals, who connect both in person and online with a focus on *permaculture*. The group began in May 2021 with a meeting held in Mirboo North, where attendees discussed what they'd like the group to be about. The consensus was that people were looking for local connections, a way to interact and learn about permaculture and sustainability.

A monthly meeting schedule was planned, usually the 3rd weekend, with alternating days and times to accommodate more members. Since the first meeting, lockdowns have caused the group to incorporate online sessions via zoom, and brainstorm inventive ways to keep connected during these times of uncertainty. A committee has been formed with co-conveners, secretaries, treasurers and other willing helpers to build this network into a new branch of Permaculture Victoria, pending acceptance by their committee.

The group has already enjoyed a seed saving workshop held by "The Fairy Seed-mothers", as well as an online meeting brainstorming session to create safe ways to connect during a pandemic, such as the possibility of an online forum, a "Seed Dating" or seed swap event where members can spend time getting to know each other and arrange snail mail swaps for seeds or recipes etc.

The group has pending plans for future in person meetings to be held in Meeniyan and surrounding locations for more permaculture based workshops, like planning for Spring, as well as a regular swap table, and morning or afternoon teas. There is no membership fee currently; however we do ask for people to register for the limited tickets for the in person meetings, free via Eventbrite to help with Covid restrictions and catering. Currently the in person meetings cost \$5 cash at the door per person, to help pay for the venue hire. These costs and payment methods may change in future.



Online Zoom meetings are free and hosted by Penelope Swales of Piggery Road Permaculture. 

#### Instructions

Sift flour, cocoa powder and salt into a small bowl, stir through the sugar.

In a separate small bowl, whisk the egg, milk, butter and vanilla.

Add the wet ingredients to the dry ingredients and stir with a fork until just combined.

Spoon mixture into a big 500ml mug.

Microwave on high for 70-90 seconds, or until pudding has risen and top is just set. Try not to overcook it. Repeat for a little longer if needed.

Dust with extra cocoa powder if you like, serve immediately.

The Round Table continues to carefully monitor the many exciting projects happening in Korumburra. The railway area development up behind the Post Office is currently facing delays due to heritage overlays on the land, but the council is slowly making headway up in that area. Once these issues are sorted the new Skate Park and parking area will begin. The large cream shed in front of the railway station will be dismantled shortly. This area will be greatly enhanced by having the rail trail adjacent to it (due to be completed by the end of the year), and I hope you are enjoying the odd walk along the semi-completed trail as much as we are!

Several months ago, the community was asked to submit suggestions for the name of the development to be built on the old Kindergarten site between Little Commercial & Victoria streets. Names were shortlisted to comply with strict criteria before the community cast their votes, and last month it was officially declared The Korumburra Community Hub. The contract to build the Hub has now been awarded, and the first sod will be turned next month.

The time has come around again to review our Korumburra Community Directions Statement - a document that encompasses ideas for the future of the town. It needs updating as many of the projects in the current version have either been completed or are well on the way. Please look out for your chance to have community input, as we will be seeking ideas on what future projects should be included in the new document.

You may have heard around the traps that a contract has been signed with Michael's IGA for a new supermarket in place of the current one. This is indeed the case, with the Shire clearing the path for a new full-line IGA to be built on the current Library site at the bottom of the main street. This will proceed once the library has been relocated to the new Korumburra Community Hub, which will occur some time next year.

Korumburra is going to look very different in a few years as it grows into a safer, more user friendly town centre, whilst keeping its historical charm. We are so lucky to live where we do.

#### **Hub Name Endorsed**

After extensive consultation the soon-to-be constructed Hub facility has a "new" official name. The facility will be known as the **Korumburra Community Hub**.

The naming process was necessary as all significant buildings, roads, localities and features in Victoria must have an official name to help ensure public safety and to help with navigation.

Selected names are registered with Geographic Names Victoria and this information is passed on to emergency services. South Gippsland Shire Council commenced the naming process early – before construction – so as the community could become familiar with the adopted name.

The naming process was undertaken over a number of months starting with a public submission period held in March which attracted 42 name suggestions. These names were then short-listed with assistance from the Korumburra & District Historical Society and the Korumburra Round Table. A voting period then occurred with 181 votes recorded. The new place name was endorsed at Wednesday's Council Meeting and will now be forwarded to Geographic Names Victoria for final consideration and approval.

#### South Gippsland Shire Council Chair Administrator said:

"We would like to thank everyone who took the time to submit a name suggestion or to vote for their favourite name. Although the final name is perhaps not too surprising it does clearly articulate the location and function of the new facility. When complete the Korumburra Community Hub will be a great asset for our local community."






