Friends of Korumburra Botanical Park

Great news!! We are pleased to advise that SGSC have approved our proposed Constitution. We need to sign a Letter of Understanding to cover SGSC & DELWP requirements, the text of which has been agreed to by all parties. We will be forming an Incorporated Association called "Friends of Korumburra Botanic Park Inc."

A couple more meetings will be required before we call an Inaugural General Meeting. This will most likely occur early April 2022.

Also, a small Community Grant to improve a drainage area near the rotunda in the Park has been approved. KCDA very kindly agreed to auspice this grant for us as we are not yet incorporated and are holding the funds on our behalf.

The works involve spraying and removal of weeds from the drainage area and in late winter/early spring putting approx. 650 indigenous plants in this area.

Ongoing weed maintenance will be required.

We will be holding work parties shortly to clear the area. Notification of work parties will be made on the Korumburra Noticeboard Facebook Page until our own page is up and running.

Many residents are keen to see the Park maintained and improved so here is a chance to make a difference for the community.

Korumburra Cemetery Trust

The Korumburra Cemetery on Kardella Road was established in Korumburra and gazetted in 1894 and has been part of the Community ever since. Over 6000 Korumburra residents have been interred within the Cemetery from all walks of life from babies to the aged and all religions or those with no religious beliefs.

All this time Volunteers have spent many hours maintaining the Cemetery Grounds and the records of Deaths and Burials since in 1894. The Trust over the last 20 odd years have been involved in various projects namely computerizing the records, a big thanks to Doug Boston and Doug Close these are now in place in the new Gazebo, a new toilet, sealing internal roads adding the Monumental Garden, extra Niche Walls, Rose Gardens, extra beams and a new storage shed this has been achieved by good planning with support from the Dept of Health with grants. The Committee has recently set about adding extra Seating and Rubbish Bins built from recycled material, we have been supported by the local Community including Moyarra Community, Korumburra Lions, Italian Social Club, Koringal Ladies Services Club, Korumburra Rotary Club, Kardella CWA, Don Tonkin, Corrie George, Eric Godfrey with various donations. This support has been a tremendous help for the Trust in their efforts to complete the project. We would also like to personally thank Clubs members of these Clubs for their support. These addition to the facilities will make it easier for people attending Funerals or visitors attending graves of past family members to move around the Cemetery with more ease. All donations are welcomed by the Trust. The Trust has been working on two other projects including another Rose Garden and the extension of the Cemetery into the eight acres beside the current Cemetery, we have had plans drawn up in preparation of this extension which will probably take place within the next five years. We expect this will cost in excess of \$100.000.

We would hope we have some support from the Department of Health with grants, the balance of the money will be required to come from local funds being managed prudently by the Trust. This extra area of the Cemetery will service the Korumburra Community long into the future for the residents.

The Trust would also like to thank all attendees of the Cemetery for the respect they show for the graves and facilities within the Cemetery and to those adding Head Stones, Vaults etc for maintaining the standards in place over many years. The Cemetery Trust has some reservations available in the Monumental Section but have had to limit reservations in all areas of the Lawn Sections until we can open the new area when finance is in place as space is limited. A big thank you to the Local Community for supporting the Korumburra Cemetery when in attendance, for supporting the Trust members and Staff efforts to keep a well maintained Cemetery that the Local Community can be proud of now and into the future.



Scrabble Group

You may ask "Why do you play scrabble?"

We don't follow all of the official game rules. We don't challenge words. Consulting a dictionary before laying down tiles is acceptable to us and we have fun browsing for obsolete and archaic words. We know a great many uncommon two-letter words, words that would never make it into everyday conversation. As one of our players often says "Can you put it in a sentence?". That is often a challenge at times.

Two-letter words are an essential part of play, especially during frustrating games when the letters are against you. Building boxes with cheap little words can be worth a surprising number of points. The strategic placement of "zo" (hybrid yak) can be worth a minimum of 62 points. There are some games, though, when even a dictionary can't help pull a rabbit out of the hat. Those are the games when playing "ot" (urchin) or "ai" (three-toed sloth) for four points leads to the question, "Why do we play this game?"

Scrabble is a great way to learn new words. It also requires adding, multiplying, and recalling the three times table. The scorekeeper has the added challenge of adding points while simultaneously plotting their next play. Scrabble is a pleasant way to spend time together and believe it or not, Scrabble has a spiritual element. Because it requires concentration and focus, Scrabble keeps one in the mo-



ment. Like meditative or contemplative practices, it calms the restless churning of the grist mill of the mind. Scrabble teaches patience and humility. It is pointless to rail when a game is going badly or to crow after a clever, high scoring play. Pride goes before a fall, and the tide may turn against you. A drubbing is just as possible as a lopsided win.



"Why do we play this game?" you may ask "Because we are hopeful people," Like a new day, every Scrabble game represents a new beginning, another opportunity to face challenges, successes and failures with grace. We play Scrabble because hope springs eternal.

Arawata Landcare Group

Weeds are most prevalent now and time is imminent to act now.

I am the President of the Arawata Landcare group and would like to you to consider your neighbors regarding weeds on your property. The Arawata Landcare group has one of the largest number of families who are members and act responsibly to control infestations of weeds listed on the priority list that of the Department of Economic Development, Jobs, Transport and Resources (DEDJTR).

We hope that locals (Arawata, Kardella, Korumburra. Ruby, Fairbank, Wild Dog Valley, Strzelecki, Ranceby, Mt Eccles, Leongatha North, Wooreen) continue to meet the community standard which is largely pioneer based and has been degraded somewhat by attrition, subdivision, tree changers and absentee owners.

Our immediate family of which half the district of Arawata is still farming across this landscape and have maintained the standard of weed control of which we are truly proud. Our family are descendants of LEC Holmes who was our great grandfather and who named the district of Arawata from name of the boat that the family emigrated from New Zealand. "Land of the Lyrebird".

<u>"Hobby Farmers" with small land holdings are not exempt from the State laws un-</u> der the CALP Act as set out below.

Legal responsibilities of landowners... Catchment and Land Protection Act 1994

Under the CALP Act, all landowners are legally required to manage declared noxious weeds and pest animals on their land. This means landowners must take all reasonable steps to

- Eradicate regionally prohibited weeds
- Prevent the growth and spread of regionally controlled weeds
- Prevent the spread of and as far as possible eradicate established pest animals on their land

Read more about your legal responsibilities for managing invasive species.

Penalties for offences under the CALP Act

If you don't comply with section 20 of the CLP Act, the government can serve a Directions Notice or Land Management Notice on a landowner that outlines measures that must be taken for the control or eradication of noxious species on your land. It's an offence to not comply with the conditions of these notices. The maximum penalty for a single offence involving:

 \cdot responsibilities for the management of noxious weeds are about \$38,000 (true as of 2018)

• importing, keeping, releasing or selling a prohibited pest animal is about \$76,000 (true as of 2018)

Korumburra Landcare

A different article this season, one using the Gardens4Wildlife initiative, it starts in your small yard!!

Planting an indigenous plants garden (seeds sourced locally of local native plants) is a great way to attract the local wildlife. They are already genetically suited to the soils/climate of the local area, so no extra care is needed (great for the not so green thumbs!). You can easily make a formal or contemporary garden using indigenous plants if you like the manicured front/back yard look too.

Key things to remember and think about:-

*What am I wanting to attract? Birds, frogs, lizards, bees/insects?

*Less is more; planting a few species but mass planting these species is better bang for your buck and the animals you are wanting to attract.

Some types of plants to think about if you are wanting to attract birds (parrots/wrens/ spinebills etc)

*Dianella sp (the fruit is loved by parrots), flowers are good for bees

*Acacia vertcillata (Prickly mosses) great for little birds to hide in

*Goodenia ovata (Hop Goodenia) good establishing shrub with yellow flowers

*Bursaria spinosa (Sweet Bursaria) white flowers/ sweet smelling good prickly cover for small birds

*Olearia lirata (Snow Daisy-bush) clusters of white flowers

*Indigofera australis (Austral Indigo) purple flowers (pictured)

*Prostanthera melissifolia (Balm Mint Bush) dense quick growing bush, purple flowers, leaves smell like mint (pictured)

*Coprosma quadrifida (Prickly Current Bush) produces fruits, prickly for small bird habitat/refuge

*Viola hederacea (Native Violet) ground cover with white/purple flowers (pictured) These species should be found at the local indigenous plant nurseries around Sth Gipp/Bass Coast.
