A New "Friends of" Group Proposal: Woodford Reserve Korumburra—We need your support!

We are three local residents working towards forming a Friends group which will assist in the maintenance and enhancement of Woodford Reserve, hidden away at the end of Woodford Place, Korumburra. This reserve encompasses the headwaters of Foster Creek and is planted out with indigenous plants at the headwaters and along the creek's banks.

We propose supplementing existing indigenous plantings, enhancing the area further to provide a beautiful natural bushland area for local people to enjoy, to support local wildlife and to help improve water quality in the creek. We are in the process of liaising with Council on the formation of this group, and are in contact with Korumburra Landcare and Bass Coast Landcare Network.

As a starting point, a Walk & Talk, for residents whose property abuts the reserve, was held on 30 April, and attendees were keen to see the formation of such a group. We'd be happy to run other Walk & Talks for others who are interested.

As the wetter and colder months are upon us, it's the time of year to stay indoors rugged up and having soups and roasts. It is also the time of year to get plants in the ground!!!



Back at the end of April we had a farm walk out at Libby and Marin Haynes gorgeous revegetated property apply named "Mugs Gully". Almost 40 years of slowly but surely revegetating the gullys around the property has paid off. They believe since their first planting they have put over 40 000 trees and understory in. Their story like many others shows what you can do over time, not needing to accomplish it all at once. They are an inspiration for new landholders around the area, of what you can do to help restore the native corridors, creek beds and land in general.

Coming up, we have a Community Planting at Woodford place/near a section of Foster Creek in town in June (date TBC). This area was brought to our attention by one of our new members, we are working closely with South Gippsland Shire to help make this section look fantastic. We have also donated plants to Korumburra Secondary College due to having Junior Landcare funds sitting in the bank and thought this would be a worthwhile project. Our members will be invited to join the students at the school to do a planting in June. We will also have a few planting days on private landholders properties. Friends of Korumburra Botanic Park Incorporated

Great news!! We are pleased to advise that following our Inaugural General Meeting on Tuesday 26.4.22 our Association is now Incorporated. We have signed a Letter of Understanding to cover SGSC & DELWP requirements, the text of which has been agreed to by all parties.

Our small Community Grant to improve a drainage area near the rotunda in the Park is progressing. The removal of weeds from the drainage area will take place from mid May onwards after the herbicide has had full effect. In late winter/early spring we will be putting approx. 650 indigenous plants in this area.

We have also held several work parties to remove Ivy off the Botanic trees and more are planned.

Now that our Facebook page is up and running, we will use that site to advise when we will be holding work parties in the Park.

Many residents are keen to see the Park maintained and improved so here is a chance to make a difference for the community.

We can educate people, we can provide contacts for contractors, we can give support and information, but only if we are asked...Refer Burra Flyer Autumn Edition page 18. We rely on Real Estate firms to pass on a **welcome pack** of services and responsibilities of new land holders...provided by KCDA.

We definitely do not have any jurisdiction to prosecute or give consequences to those landowners however we should at least contact the offenders directly ourselves or you may get forms from DELP phone 5662 9900("Lands Department") that would escalate the situation. Remember there are also a lot of public spaces too that are the jurisdiction of **public land managers** (that don't seem to care one way or the other).

Very disappointing and it happens every year at the same time when the flowers are prevalent. Any action that is taken is futile as the seed is set.

Any tree projects of significant size should be checked annually for Blackberry as birds and foxes use this habitat.

Korumburra Round Table

Well what a wonderful summer we have had in Korumburra, and nowhere is this



more evident than on our newly opened portion of the Great Southern Rail Trail – from Korumburra to Leongatha. Officially launched on March 26th, the trail has been a very busy place over the past few months, for cyclists, walkers, bird lovers, families with babies in strollers, and horse riders alike; and the Round Table is proud to have played on ongoing role in advocating for this project over the past five years. We excitedly await the opening of the final leg of this project – from Loch to Nyora.

Members of the Round Table continue to question council on the range of projects underway around Korumburra, which include construction of the Korumburra Hub (well underway now in little Commercial Street – see artist's impression below), the subsequent move of the library *to* that hub, the redevelopment of the railway land surrounding the rail trail, the IGA supermarket to be built on the library site, and the main street redevelopment.

The Round Table has also been particularly excited to learn about the resurgence of interest in our remarkable local asset – the Korumburra Botanic Park. The recently formed Friends of Korumburra Botanic Park have just held their *third* working bee down at that beautiful 12-acre site at the bottom of Bridge St. If you have never ventured down there, I would encourage you to do so as it is truly our town's hidden gem.

At the next meeting of the Round Table our local council's Manager of Infrastructure Delivery is coming along to answer our questions, and we will be keen to hear council's views on, for example: undergrounding of the power lines when the main street redevelopment occurs next year - what are the chances? And electric vehicle charging stations as part of the upgrade – where will they be? And how about memorial or sponsored seating along the rail trail – is this a possibility?

If you would also like to know the council's position on any of these issues and more, watch this space in the next edition, and I shall report back

2022 has started with our members happy to be back playing music in a friendly and relaxed environment. At our AGM in March, we celebrated the Band's 130th Birthday. The Band was officially established on the 19th February 1892 as the Leongatha Town Band, making it the oldest community group in Leongatha.

Their first concert was in the Mechanics Institute in 1893, although the musicians probably entertained the locals before this. The first official engagement was welcoming home a wounded soldier from the Boer War at the Leongatha Railway Station in 1900.

. In 1919 the band performed at a Concert and social evening for soldiers returning after the First World War, beginning a long association with the RSL.

In 1945, after the Second World War, the Band greeted soldiers coming home at the Leongatha Railway Station. Also in 1945 the band changed its name to Woorayl Municipal Band, a title it carried until 1995 when it was called the South Gippsland Shire Brass Band.

Again this ANZAC Day the Band was honoured to be involved in the Memorial Ceremony in Leongatha, and bugling 'The Last Post' at local events.

South Gippsland Beekeepers

Ever wondered how bees survive in the winter when they cannot get out into the garden as the wind howls and the rain pelts



down? Beekeepers have now tucked the little lades away packing down their hives to as few boxes as they can, to conserve heat. For the most part honey bees spend the cold days and nights inside their hive eating the honey and pollen stored up over the summer and autumn. Their numbers dwindle and the queen bee usually stops laying eggs until the spring. The bees are very busy during the colder months keeping the hive warm. If there are still autumn baby bees to hatch the hive must be approx 34c - 24/7. If there is no brood then the hive must be approx 22c to keep the queen alive. The way the bees do this by creating a tight cluster, with the gueen in the centre as they vibrate their wing muscles. This cluster works the same way as a huddle of penguins. The bees on the outside create a wall until it is their turn to gradually move to the centre, where they can warm up and then move back to the outside again. Aren't they the most amazing little critters! Beekeepers spend the winter getting ready for the massive spring growths - flowers and bee populations.
