Partnership and Support Program with the Foundation for Regional and Rural Renewal F-RRR. As one of only three communities in Victoria have been chosen by the F-RRR we now have support to move into the future with strength and a particular focus on Resilience.

F-RRR is a not for profit organisation that connects common purposes from funding, business and philanthropy with the a resilient and revitalised remote, regional and rural Australia. They both create and seek grants to fund projects. Since 2000, they have delivered more than \$135 million to more than 12,000 projects.

Cards and pens were provided and many hundreds of ideas poured in. At a subsequent meeting with F-RRR in Korumburra, these ideas were collated to produce a selection of broad underlying themes.

We had a solid discussion around the idea of resilience (which has different interpretations for different community members) and how best to formulate a plan that includes the voices of all community members that has its emphasis on Strengthening the Town of Korumburra. Updates to follow.



#### Foundation Member of Citizens Advice Bureau Retires

Shirley Reeves OAM retired from the South Gippsland Citizens Advice Bureau Inc. after more than forty years of service.

"What will we do without her? She has always been the backbone of our service to the community," said one volunteer.

Shirley was a foundation member of the CAB and helped establish it in 1978. She has been an important member for over 44 years. During that time Shirley trained hundreds of volunteers in the accredited Community Information Workers Course and was instrumental in keeping up the high standard of service the CAB gives the community of South Gippsland. Shirley was a Committee Member and office bearer of the CAB Committee from 1985 to 2010.

Shirley organized the 40<sup>th</sup> Birthday of the CAB in 2018. At the celebration at that time Russell Broadbent, the Federal Member of Parliament called her "the amazing Shirley Reeves" in his address to the gathering, and later in his speech to Parliament.

Shirley was awarded the OAM medal (Order of Australia) for youth and community work. As well, she was South Gippsland Shire Citizen of the Year.

The South Gippsland Citizens Advice Bureau is very grateful to Shirley for all her dedication and work with them over many years, and she will be sadly missed. They wish her a very happy retirement.

As well as her CAB work, Shirley was a Leader in the Joey Scouts, South Gippsland District, for over 52 years from which she recently retired. She has helped form the lives of many young people in the Scouting Movement.

#### **Friends of Coal Creek**

We had an immensely informative meeting with the Team Leader at Coal Creek, Kim O'Connell, on Wednesday 9th of November, thank you to those who came.

There's been so much going on behind the scenes, and we are very grateful to be able to pass on some of this progress to the community. To start, everyone's favourite attraction - the tramways, have been undergoing some initial investigations, by two well renowned and very experienced railway engineers, who work on both the Mornington Heritage Railways and Puffing Billy. Preliminary works will commence soon, and we hope to see the trains up and running again sooner than later.

We're pleased to hear that there have been remediation works on the Poppet Head in recent weeks, to ensure its building integrity and to lay the ground for restoration works. In addition the Poppet Head and 12 other buildings are to undergo Stage 1 non-invasive engineering assessments in December this year. This is the first of many stages required to lovingly restore the buildings so that they are functional and safe for years to come.

The gardens both inside and outside the Park are also getting some much needed love, with the Friends of Coal Creek to collaborate with Shire gardeners to restore and replant the front gardens.

Coal Creek are now also in touch with the Bunurong Land Council Aboriginal Corporation to discuss and encourage the incorporation of this regions First Nations history and knowledge of the land into the park. The intention is to develop native revegetation in sections of the Park for everyone to enjoy.

Coming inside the Main Entrance Building, the auditorium is set to be developed into a dedicated white wall gallery space, with immersive video and interactive media capability.

There were also talks of the Halloween festival, that many remember fondly. Halloween can return as a community driven event with aid from the Shire!

The 12th of December Korumburra Farmers Market will coincide with the first official guided tours of Coal Creek, so make sure to come down to the farmer's market and follow it up with a tour of the Park.

This is an immense leap forward in the progress of Coal Creek, and it can't be done alone. Christian Stefani, Penni Ellicott, Kim O'Connell and the Coal Creek team are doing a wonderful job, and it's time for the community to rally behind Coal Creek.



None of this is possible without the help of volunteers. This is the time for everyone in the community to get involved! It doesn't matter if you think you have no experience, or you could only donate a small amount of time, if you want to become a volunteer, and be a part of history in the making, now is better than ever. Whether you get involved with us, the Friends of Coal Creek or direct to Coal Creek, the first step is to enroll in the Shire Volunteer program. #### Korumburra Landcare

Grant approval for the project Restoring Habitat in the Upper Powlett & Tarwin Catchments has been successfully funded through the 2022/23 Victorian Landcare Grants. In total, we have been funded \$19501.86 excusing GST. These funds are already allocated to landholders, which is great news, and means we will have another busy planting season on 2023.

All the plantings for 2022 season are well and truly in the ground. It was a mammoth effort from the committee, and each landholder. It's all worth it knowing the environment will get a big boost as the plants grow and mature. All these pockets of revegetation, goes towards habitat for a lot of animals, including microbats, macropods, lizards, insects, amphibians, and birds.

As summer hits, it's the time of year to get stuck into blackberry removal. As all their energy goes into flowering and fruiting, it's the perfect time to hit them, they have less energy to fight off treatment. Whether you use chemical or a slower methodical chemical free approach, late December-March is the best time to tackle the spikey weed. Contact Bass Coast Landcare Network (BCLN) for advice and best practice methods for managing blackberry.

#### Korumburra Round Table



Hello everyone,

As always there is SO much happening in our little town. The Korumburra Hub project is right on track, with the windows having arrived after a lengthy delay, and the main stakeholders getting ready to move in, in February. Little Commercial Street is a hive of activity, and is being completed section be section, with carparking becoming available as each section is completed. The final design of the Main Street upgrade is in the pipeline now, and we are working with the Shire to ensure the best result is achieved for the available budget. The main change to Commercial Street will be that, rather than two lanes of traffic each way, there will be one lane and a wider area next to that lane, giving vehicles a safe space to pull over and reverse park while the single lane of traffic continues through. To better visualise this, an example can be seen on Mine Rd outside the Primary School. The footpath will also be upgraded for the length of Commercial Street.

Up at the railway precinct, both the new parking area and the skate park are being delayed due to heritage issues, but they are slowly making headway, as is the Railway Station itself, which is finally being restored by VicTrack. Our community will get to decide how best this building could be used by the community. Do you have an idea? If so, send an email to milpara@dcsi.net.au.

There have been several high-profile hacks on companies in Australia where customers' personal data has been stolen. I'm looking at you Medibank, MyDeal (Woolworths) and Optus...

In addition, the number of scams and hacks on personal devices keeps rising. This is a timely reminder to review your own personal security measures and backup procedures. Here are a few tips for minimising your own personal risks.

- 1. **Close any unused online accounts and services**. This includes unused email addresses, online shopping accounts, financial services, social media.
- 2. **Turn on two-factor authentication** for your email, social media accounts and other services. Examples include PayPal, eBay, Facebook, VicRoads, Amazon, Google, Outlook, etc. If the option for two-factor authentication exists, use it.
- 3. Change your passwords. Never re-use the same passwords. Make your passwords complex. Write them down in a safe place and make a note of the date so you have some idea of how old the password is when you return to it later. Even better use an online password manager BUT this is only recommended for those are reasonably tech savvy because they require a bit of learning and ongoing maintenance. The rewards are great though. LastPass and 1Password are examples of good, reliable password managers.
- 4. **Back up your computer, tablet and phone**. Preferably use a cloud-based service like Apple iCloud, Microsoft OneDrive or Google Drive. A secondary backup of your photos and important documents on a portable hard drive is also a good idea.
- 5. **Unsubscribe from all that junk email** but only from legitimate companies. Dodgy emails are better just deleted. Be wary of who you give your email address to. Does that retailer really need your personal details?
- 6. **Don't answer unsolicited phone calls** but if you do, never give callers any personal information or allow them to access your computer or phone. If you initiated the phone call then it's likely OK, but you should still proceed with caution.


