

We welcome anyone who wants to just come along for a couple of weeks to see what we are all about.


Experience is not essential to join our choir. We learn by ear so there is no prerequisite to be able to read music.


Friends of Woodford Reserve Inc. Korumburra








South Gippsland Shire Brass Band

There is plenty happening in around the Shire, including in Korumburra with the new Hub set to be open to the public later this year and the streetscape development progressing. The Council have also committed funding to the refurbishment of the Korumburra Railway Station site to make it into an ongoing community asset. The public toilet facilities in the vicinity of the rail precinct will be renewed as part of the planned parking and landscaping works.

Unfortunately there is a delay in moving forward with the Korumburra Skate Park as a result of the heritage overlay, however Council officers are working through the requirements to progress the project. I am extremely excited to see these projects complete and how our community will benefit.

The Council is undertaking an Industrial Land Use Strategy. It's no secret that Korumburra plays an important local role in the economic prosperity of our region and that there is a shortage of industrial land in Korumburra. 

Korumburra Staying Strong

Following on from last editions article where we have learned that the key to resilience in Korumburra, is a way for the community to continually engage in doing things for the town, maintaining energy and momentum. We want to be a group that helps connect everyone.

This brings us to the present where we have put together a couple of projects that meet these needs. The first is a Korumburra Helping Hub. The funding, which we are hopeful will be approved any day now by Foundation of Rural & Regional Renewal, will provide a coordinator for this project.

The Hub vision is to consist of an interactive website, as a way of linking multiple volunteers and community groups. Volunteering could be in a range of areas such as music, art, farming, cleaning, gardening, handy work, computers, business, and other skill areas. In addition, we can support creative local projects ideas to come to fruition.

The Hub can also include Meet and Greet days, and possibly a Helping Hand morning one day per month. It will be a network that connects people who need help with people that want to help. The funding allows for the project to be well coordinated and will make an exciting addition to our community.

The second project is painting and beautifying the rest of the railway tunnel to complement the existing mural. There are a few hurdles to get over before this one is ready to commence. This project is to provide a safe and positive place, and to counteract vandalism by promoting a sense of local pride in the subway. With all the information we have gathered from the community, we have loads of ideas to ensure the mural represents the community from the ancient presence of first nation people to stories of the current day. A local artist will be employed to develop a design and complete the project.



Keep an eye out in your mailboxes as we have arranged to have a Community Support booklet delivered to every household in Korumburra. These booklets have been put together by both South Gippsland & Bass Coast Shire and are a comprehensive list of services, many that you may not be aware of but may very well need at some stage. Keep this booklet handy for future reference.

Building a resilient community.

Korumburra Business Association

Things are beginning to look exciting in Korumburra with the completion of Little Commercial Street. The area has a combination of all KORUMBURRA day and one hour parking spots. In the earlier days of planning there BUSINESS ASSOCIATION was no consideration for all day parking, but the Business Association has listened to these concerns and worked with the Shire to have this changed. The one hour parking is causing some concern and after discussions with the Shire, this will remain unchanged at present until all works and upgrades have been completed. We will continue to monitor the situation but, in the meantime, it will increase the opportunity for customers seeking a parking spot when doing a short stop. We all know change can be difficult but lets give it a go!

The area behind the Post Office and Kelly's Bakery is the next section to gain a face life. The work is due to start this month and will obviously cause disruption and inconvenience. We need to focus on the end result and utilise other areas in the meantime. Short term pain for long term gain.

Traffic lights at the Radovick Street/Commercial Street intersection is something the Business Association has been advocating for over a long period. This would include the pedestrian crossing moving to this intersection at the time of the Commercial Street upgrade. We are not always successful and this is not occurring in the foreseeable future but has been factored into the design and should be a project in the distant future. We also continued to advocate for having the power supply placed underground at the time of the Commercial street upgrade but have been unsuccessful in this pursuit

Korumburra Landcare Group

Ah Winter, conjures up images of rugging up, heater cranking, soups, roasts and curling up on the couch with a book or TV show. Whereas Winter is also the busiest few months of the year for Landcare groups, as its also known as planting season!!!

This is the best time of year for planting indigenous/native tubes tock for revegetation around your property. Many reasons for this but a few basic reasons are: -soil is cooler, so the roots don't get too hot and die, usually the frosts have gone/lesser of them in a row meaning less likely for younger plants to die from frost, most indigenous plants are in their dormant phase, it doesn't affect them as much to be moved from a small pot into the ground.

Revegetation for landholders, gives many benefits, these can include shelter belts for stock animals, makes use of the steep hills that stock should be kept off for safety, helps stop landslips, helps filter the rain runoff into the rivers/creeks and your dam, in turn promoting cleaner and healthier water and it also serves as natural habitat for the local wildlife.

We have 4 planting days on members properties coming up, please take note of

Korumburra Cemetery Trust



The Korumburra Cemetery on Kardella Road was established in Korumburra and gazetted in 1894 and has been part of the Community ever since. Over 6000 Korumburra residents have been interred within the Cemetery from all walks of life from babies to the aged and all religions or those with no religious beliefs. All this time Volunteers have spent many hours maintaining the Cemetery Grounds and the records of Deaths and Burials since in 1894. The Trust over the last 20 odd years have been involved in various projects namely computerizing the records, a big thanks to Doug Boston and Doug Close these are now in place in the new Gazebo, a new Toilet, Sealing internal roads adding the Monumental Garden, extra Niche Walls, Rose Gardens, extra beams and a new storage shed this has been achieved by good planning with support from the Dept of Health with grants.

The Committee has recently set about adding extra Seating and Rubbish Bins built from recycled material, we have been supported by the local Community including Moyarra Community, Korumburra Lions, Italian Social Club, Karingal Ladies Services Club, Korumburra Rotary Club, Kardella CWA, Don Tonkin, Corrie George, Eric Godfrey with various donations. This support has been a tremendous help for the Trust in their efforts to complete the project. We would also like to personally thank Clubs members of these Clubs for their support. These addition to the facilities will make it easier for people attending Funerals or visitors attending graves of past family members to move around the Cemetery with more ease. All donations are welcomed by the trust

The Trust has been working on two other projects including another Rose Garden and the extension of the Cemetery into the eight acres beside the current Cemetery, we have had plans drawn up in preparation of this extension which will probably take place withing the next five years. We expect this will cost in excess of \$100,000. We would hope we have some support from the Department of Health with grants, the balance of the money will be required to come from local funds being managed prudently by the Trust. This extra area of the Cemetery will service the Korumburra Community long into the future for the local residents.

The Trust would also like to thank all attendees of the Cemetery for the respect they show for the graves and facilities within the Cemetery and to those adding Head Stones, Vaults etc for maintaining the standards in place over many years. The Cemetery Trust has some reservations available in the Monumental Section but have had to limit reservations in all areas of the Lawn Sections until we can open up the new area when finance is in place as space is limited. A big thank you to the Local Community for supporting the Korumburra Cemetery when in attendance, for supporting the Trust members and Staff efforts to keep a well maintained Cemetery that the Local Community can be proud of now and into the future.


Korumburra Friends of Red Cross

Legacy

Sir Stanley Savige: The Founder of Legacy

Legacy grew out of the Ashes of World War 1. Over 60 000 Service personnel were killed during the War and more than 150 000 were wounded Many of these died soon after.

Realising the dire circumstances of the tens of thousands of veterans, widows and children left behind, those who returned set out to help them. In 1923, Major General Sir John Gellibrand formed the Remembrance Club in Hobart. Another returning soldier, Lieutenant General Sir Stanley Savige was inspired to establish another club in Melbourne. This club was named Legacy and it is celebrating its Centenary this year.

There is a local connection to Sir Stanley Savige, he was born in Morwell on 26 June 1890. The family originally lived in Korumburra. He left Korumburra Primary School at the age of 12 to work as a blacksmith's striker. He joined the School's Junior Cadets (Scouts) as a Bugler. The family moved from Korumburra to Prahran in 1907. He had an interest in community work and soldiering serving as a senior cadet and scout master between 1907 and 1915.

He enlisted in the AIF on 6 March 1915 and landed in Gallipoli in September 1915, he received a series of promotions and was commissioned at Lone Pine on 9 November 1915. He commanded one of his Battalion's rear-guard parties the following month. He was then posted to France where he saw action in a number of the great battles and was awarded the Military Cross. In 1918, he volunteered to go to Palestine as part of Dunsterforce where he received the Distinguished Service Order for protecting refugees while under fire.

He passed away on 15 June 1954 and the Rotary Club of Korumburra erected a gate

in his honour in Coleman Park in 1955, My wife and I and a couple of our Legacy widows dropped into the park a little while ago. Some of you will know this of course but the park is quite pretty and the memorial from World War 1 is impressive. ~Phil Head



Bena Hall




Further work parties will be held usually on Thursdays and Saturdays when members are available and the weather is suitable.


Friends of Coal Creek


