

Jumbunna Markets Revival

If you haven't been to one of Jumbunna's markets, hurry up and visit. While COVID lockdowns had a huge impact, this small community has been busy re-invigorating its longstanding monthly Bush Market while also starting a quarterly Artisan Market.



Bush Market

The Jumbunna Bush Market is a 'trash and treasure' type of market. Stallholders can just show up before 9am on market days and get a table. The market is held on the first Sunday of the month and is open from 9am to 12.30pm. Coffee, tea, cakes, and sandwiches are available and are so popular they often sell out well before the market ends. Dates for this market are: Sunday 3 September, Sunday 1 October, Sunday 5 November, Sunday 3 December.

Artisan Market at Jumbunna

The Artisan Market is a quarterly market featuring local designers and makers as well as a selection of artisan foods. Since its first event early last year, the Artisan Market has gathered a large following as it is the only one of its kind in the area. 40 years of Jumbunna Bush Market

To be celebrated 1st of October 2023 Anniversary celebrating Jumbunna Hall's Bush Market which is steeped in history. The land upon which the hall stands was donated to the community by the Mine managers. The miners built the hall, and the local farmers etc. made improvements. There are families with many generations of assisting at working bees and markets. The Wylie family seen in the photo have five

generations with connections with the hall, as miners and farmers. The Enbom family farmers have four generations connected to the hall and market, the Smith family, Myra & Graeme Smith, Barbara Young, as well as Adrian Kells, Jim & Margaret Eigenraam, Thelma Faragah and there are others too including newcomers to the area!

The main street through Jumbunna, Cruickshank Rd, was considered an open road with a 100km/hour speed limit. This caused great concern among village residents, as some people appeared hellbent on doing the max speed in this very short, narrow, residential street. A petition from residents has seen the removal of 100km signage on Cruickshank Road, with the whole town now being subject to a 60km speed limit.



MS Plus, Aged Care Volunteer Visitors Scheme (ACVVS)

For many elderly residents, getting older can be a lonely experience.

Seeing a friendly face and having a regular visitor can help change all that. The Aged Care Volunteer Visitors Scheme (formerly known as the Community Visitors Scheme) matches volunteer visitors to residents living in an aged care facility, or to someone living in their own home that is in receipt of (or waitlisted for) a home care package.

The purpose of this program is to help diminish the feelings of isolation and loneliness. As the program coordinator of the ACVVS over the Bass Coast and South Gippsland Shires, I would love to see more volunteer visitors join. While we have older people waiting for a visitor all over these regions, there is currently a particular need right here in Korumburra. I am looking for people who enjoy spending time with the elderly, and who want to be a listening ear, friendly face, and a friend. In the elderly community, isolation is a major issue. Incidental contact may be minimal,

and some residents can find themselves spending a lot of time sitting in their room, alone.

The ACVVS invites something new into their week, and the benefits go both ways. Many of our volunteer visitors talk about how much they too, get out of the program. They have someone new in their life that becomes special to them and end up getting more out of it than what they give. We ask that our volunteer visitors come to the program with the ability to commit to weekly (preferred) or fortnightly visits and are with the program for a minimum of 12 months.

The Korumburra Cemetery is working hard on a series of projects to ensure our Cemetery and surrounds is an area of the Local Community that visitors to the Cemetery are proud of. Korumburra Cemetery in 2024 it will be 130 years since the first Interment in 1894, there were three local cemeteries the others being Poowong and Outtrim (Closed). Korumburra and Outtrim have many Miners from the Coal Industry in the early 1900's interred within but all three also have the Pioneers of South Gippsland interred. This could be a chance to create a monument or add a plaque within the Cemetery to recognise the commitment of our Pioneers, Miners and Migrants have made in developing this area. 2024 might be the year to recognise this commitment of these people to the area.

Work in progress at the Cemetery includes installation of a new Rose Garden, creating an area to house a marble table and seats near the Monumental garden donated by a Jumbunna family for the public to use. The Trust are very appreciative of the donation to the Cemetery Trust, we also have been donated two Granite seats we need to find a home in the Cemetery but this could be in the new extensions taking place in the next eighteen months, This will be a big project involving more internal roads and beams and another Rose Garden which could also e used for commemoration of our early settlers. We have noticed an increased interest from families in recognising deceased family members especially in the unmarked graves some going back as far as 1894, also we have been receiving requests Australia wide for details of descendants. The Trust will assist families with information should they wish to create a monument or headstone etc. The are two Monumental Masons in the area Wakelys formerly at Jumbunna now at Wonthaggi the contact is Rose Wakely 0419 396 537 and Keenan Memorials of Morwell 5134 2885 Mobile 0402 850 603. Note Keenan's are able to replace Lead Lettering with Stainless Steel lettering. The above Monumental Masons can also refurbish Headstone inscriptions if they are deteriorating. Bronze plaques can be ordered through the Cemetery Trust Secretary Geoff Wyatt 0413 081136 or Email wyatt@waterfront.net.au. Small to large Plaques are available, Emblems can be added and cameo photos of Family members can be added, about four to five week delivery.

If you are adding a container to hold flowers please do not use Glass or Ceramic holders as broken holders can be dangerous for Caretakers, Trust Staff or the Public especially when mowing. We are working on upgrading our Cemetery records on Computer and hopefully in the next three months this will happen allowing families to check on their family history etc on line. The Trust meets every two months and will handle any queries at these meetings, Secretary details above. Reservations are available in the Monumental Section at \$790 a plot, a saving of three hundred dollars, Reservations can be made for the Niche Wall, Monumental Garden or Rose Garden for Ashes. "Fewer people are now using the service, but it's all systems go," said Nicholas Peck, the Bureau's Tax Help coordinator.

"We assist clients to lodge their return, and it doesn't matter if they're confused about lodging electronically; we will help them regardless.

"Lodging is better than putting it off; it just gets more difficult later."

To make an appointment, just ring the Bureau Monday to Friday between 10 am and 2 pm (0356 622 111) to arrange a time, or you can drop in and arrange it in person.

Korumburra Medical Centre



Korumburra Medical Centre runs weekly Skin clinics. Dr Mark Bensley and Dr Yan Lu preform skin checks using Der-

matoscopy: with photos able to be stored in your patient record at the medical centre of any lesion/spot being watched. They can provide biopsy, and subsequent minor procedures to remove a suspicious lesion that has been identified and warrants removal. When appropriate they are also able to provide referral to a specialist.

The sooner a <u>skin cancer</u> is identified and treated, the better your chance of avoiding surgery or, in the case of a serious <u>melanoma</u> or other skin cancer, potential disfigurement or even death. It is also a good idea to talk to your doctor about your level of risk and for advice on early detection. It's important to get to know your skin and what is normal for you, so that you notice any changes. Skin cancers rarely hurt and are much more frequently seen than felt. Develop a regular habit of checking your skin for new spots and changes to existing freckles or <u>moles</u>. (Cancer Council). If you have developed a new spot that is different from other spots around it. If a spot, mole or unusual freckle has changed in shape, size, or colour. If you have a sore that isn't healing. And Any skin spot that you are worried about. We recommend a full body skin check at least every 12-24 months, and more regularly if you are at higher risk of skin cancers i.e fair skin, red hair, previous or family history of skin cancer. contact our clinic on 56551355 for any enquires and to arrange your next skin check.



Ah Spring, the day light hours longer, crisper mornings to go with warmer sunnier days. It's the time of year where plants of all sorts grow at maximum speed. Procreation, nesting, and babies of all kinds of animals start popping up.



It will be interesting to see if Korumburra will come under the predictions of drier weather, or if we still have our average wet Spring. We will have our last planting of 2023 on Saturday 2nd September in Bena, keep a look out on social media for flyer. This is in conjunction with Gippsland Threatened Species Action Group another group under the Bass Coast Landcare Network banner.

As of start of August we have had 2 very successful planting days, with great people, good looking bunch of plant species, good weather and a yummy lunch provided. Another 2 postponed due to how wet the sites were, but will have happen over August, you will see the write ups and photos on our Facebook page.

The time of year we see lots of different yellow flowers, from weedy species. Unkept paddocks can potentially have quite a bit of Ragwort (Senecio jacobaea) or Broom – Cape/ Montpelier (Genista monpessulana) There are many different ways to help manage infestations of both these weeds, non chem and chemical. Please research or reach out to us at Korumburra Landcare for expert advice on these weeds or any others you are having issues with.

We, Des' family, have been working hard in the background to support Des, and to clean up the Korumburra Newsagency building site-hopefully it won't be too much longer.


We value all the local businesses for helping and look forward to working with them to achieve this. However, we will not be reopening the Korumburra Newsagency.

Friends of Korumburra Botanic Park Inc.

We continue to actively work to enhance & promote the Park in association with South Gippsland Shire Council. By the time you have read this report we will have acquitted the SGSC Small Grant for the sum of \$833.00. Our volunteers have planted 530 Indigenous plants from Wonthaggi Seed Bank Nursery in the drain site over the last few months.



In addition, we have planted another 100 Carex & several Strzelecki Gums in the Park. We have continued working on cutting & painting blackberries in part of a sizeable bush area in the Botanic Park and east of the Rotunda and elsewhere in the Park. Our application to join Landcare Victoria Inc. (LVI) as a member and to acquire Insurance cover has been submitted. We hope to have approval in late August 2023.

Recent updates from Shire officers covered many of the projects that are underway in town.

Hopefully by the time this article is printed the power has been connected to Little Commercial Street streetlights by Ausnet making this area fully completed.

The landscaping is coming along nicely at the Hub and even though the opening of this project is well overdue, the result for the community will be worth the wait.

The new IGA Supermarket site handover has been completed, making a clear pathway for the development to begin on the corner of Commercial & King Streets.

You will have noticed the car parking in the railway precinct is well underway. This work includes new drainage, kerbs, defined car parking and lighting. Two electric vehicle charging stations are planned for the Bridge Street end of this area.

The public toilet block will be replaced with one similar to what has been installed at Coleman Park.

The new Skate Park has continually been held up with Heritage issues on the land. The proposed design is being reviewed and a playground designed to look like an old Goods Wagon is planned for this area.

The subway (tunnel) walkway will be concreted from Commercial Street through to the other end. A mural to be painted on the inside wall is an exciting addition and makes this a more attractive walkway for Korumburra. A concrete staircase with railing will be installed on the slope behind the Florist at the Commercial Street entry to the subway giving access to the parking area.

Ramp access to the Railway Station platform from the Rail Trail will also be installed.

The 'use' of the almost completed Railway Station restoration by Vic Track is still a work in progress. There is a strict criteria for what the 'use' can be and we are confident a solution will be found.

Lastly the Commercial Street streetscape is getting closer with the tender process beginning in August and works to commence in November. It will be completed in stages, minimising obstructions. This upgrade will include new footpaths, kerbs, garden beds and street furniture.

We have so much to be thankful for in Korumburra.
