KCDA Editorial


As always, there has been a lot happening in our great town of Korumburra since the last edition.

MS Plus, Aged Care Volunteer Visitors Scheme (ACVVS)

For many elderly residents, getting older can be a lonely experience. Seeing a friendly face and having a regular visitor can help change all

that. The Aged Care Volunteer Visitors Scheme (formerly known as the Community Visitors Scheme) matches volunteer visitors to residents living in an aged care facility, or to someone living in their own home that is in receipt of (or waitlisted for) a home care package.

The purpose of this program is to help diminish the feelings of isolation and loneliness. As the program coordinator of the ACVVS over the Bass Coast and South Gippsland Shires, I would love to see more volunteer visitors join. While we have older people waiting for a visitor all over these regions, there is currently a particular need right here in Korumburra. I am looking for people who enjoy spending time with the elderly, and who want to be a listening ear, friendly face, and a friend. In the elderly community, isolation is a major issue. Incidental contact may be minimal, and

some residents can find themselves spending a lot of time sitting in their room, alone.

The ACVVS invites something new into their week, and the benefits go both ways. Many of our volunteer visitors talk about how much they too, get out of the program. They have someone new in their life that becomes special to them and end up getting more out of it than what they give. We ask that our volunteer visitors come to the program with the ability to commit to weekly (preferred) or fortnightly visits and are with the program for a minimum of 12 months.



St Josephs Primary School

This year at St Joseph's we have continued to focus on learning with a particular emphasis on explicit direct instruction. In our junior classes, the children have been taught phonics in a targeted and specific way.



They have learnt all about how sounds make up words and we are delighted with the results we are seeing. They are reading and writing like never before!

This approach has been extended into our middle and senior school where the children are learning about the meaning of words and expressing themselves in carefully constructed, high quality written pieces.

We have just begun to embed the new Mathematics curriculum which is being rolled out across the state.

Our teachers have been building their skills and knowledge of an evidence-based approach known as *The Science of Learning*. They understand that the brain is a complex piece of machinery which, when taught in a particular way, retains and retrieves information. With this in mind, our children have been experiencing knowledge units which are exciting and thought provoking. The year 3/4s were so engaged in their knowledge unit about Mountains and created amazing models to reflect what they had learnt. Our Year 5/6s creativity and expertise shone when they invited their families in to be part of a Learning Expo about space, weather and natural disasters.

As always, the children have been involved in lots of hands on fun activities, excursions and incursions. Highlights over the year have been 100 days of school for our littlest people, Grandparents Day, our whole school excursion to Science Works, our Footsteps Dance Program, class Masses at the Church, Fathers' Day breakfast, so many incursions, special events and of course, lots of sporting opportunities, including lawn bowls!

Most of all, we are delighted with the way the children continue to uphold our school wide expectations of Respect, Responsibility and Care.

Bass Coast South Gippsland Reconciliation Group

The Group is committed to our own self-education about First Nations history and culture, and to working alongside First People towards greater understanding in the wider community. To this end we have been active in the Yes case for the referendum.

The Group was formed in 2005 and we have evolved through a number of activities and campaigns. We have run the NAIDOC Week Art Exhibition in Inverloch for the last ten or so years. We have held Indigenous film festivals and worked with local libraries in the showing of films. We have participated in Sorry Day and NAIDOC Week gatherings. We played an active part in changing the name of the McMillan electorate to Monash in 2017, after a long collaborative process with the Gunnaikurnai Lands and Waters Aboriginal Corporation and the Bunurong Land Council Aboriginal Corporation. For the last five years, we have managed, with the Bunurong Land Council, a commemoration of the first two people hanged in Victoria (then Port Phillip) in 1842, after capture in Harmers Haven and an unjust murder trial. This trial was in complete denial of the hundreds of Aboriginal men, women and children already, and about to be, murdered in the Gippsland area.

We meet monthly, more often in Inverloch on the afternoon of the third Thursday of the month, but twice a year in South Gippsland and twice in the evening. The November meeting will be held in Leongatha at 6pm for a pub meal first.

We have about two hundred members and over one hundred friends. Members receive communication about events of importance or ones we organise, and other items of interest. They also get the minutes and agendas of monthly meetings and are very welcome to attend, though many of course don't. Friends receive the notices of events etc, and some other items of interest.



Arawata Landcare Group

We welcome members and guests to our next quarterly meeting, 7.30pm on Wednesday 6 December at Arawata Hall. Our guest speaker is Dr Paul Hardy-Smith, Arawata local and a specialist aquatic veterinarian. Paul's talk will focus on the fish, crustaceans and molluscs currently being farmed in Australia, the ways they are farmed and how to maximise their eating qualities.

Arawata Landcare Group is very pleased to have received a Victorian Landcare Grant which will fund several projects in the coming year. Members will put around 8,400 indigenous plants in the ground over more than four hectares across seven properties. We will hold a farm-mapping workshop; a plant identification walk in Ritchies Reserve; and launch our on-farm biodiversity asset register pilot program on three member properties.

Our focus for the summer months is weed control, targeting ragwort, thistle and blackberry. Talk to your local supplier to find the products best suited to you and your property and include a wetting agent. Backpack spraying is more intimate and positive, however any regular spray regime will work. If you prefer manual management, cutting off flower heads and removing them from the paddocks is also an effective approach.

Korumburra Bowling Club



Korumburra Round Table

By the time you are reading this, the Korumburra Community Hub will have been officially opened and the Opening Week of Activities concluded. I am sure the hub has already been mentioned many times throughout this publication, but from the point of view of the Round Table, it deserves just one more plug. You see, from our point of view, the Hub was always part of a bigger plan for Korumburra, which is gradually coming to fruition.



First there was the total reconstruction of Little Commercial Street, with the parking changes, resurfacing,

different access points leading into and out of the Hub and all the landscaping around the site, all of which caused some disruption for a number of months. Then the old kinder site started to be transformed into the building we see today, with its breathtaking outlook over our rolling hills. Both of these stages involved Council attending the Round Table's monthly meetings over several years, to answer every one of our ever-burgeoning questions on how it would all pan out, in an effort to ensure the best outcome for our town.

At the same time, works have continued up around the railway precinct, including the station itself, and that area will eventually not only provide a great deal more parking for our main street, but will be transformed into a recreation and arts precinct nestling up against the rail trail and the historic railway station, and I cannot wait to see all of that come together over the next year. And starting very shortly – the main street itself.

By the time the *next* edition of the Flyer comes out, the Commercial St revitalization project will be well underway. As with the building of the Hub, it will cause disruption. There will be pain and inconvenience on occasion, as well as an unsightly mess as the highway converts to one lane in each direction. But, just as with the Hub and the railway precinct, we would urge our local residents to look past the immediate inconvenience and look forward to the completed outcome. We know from this Hub experience that that's the trajectory of change – a little pain for a lot of gain; and if we sit on our existing facilities and resist these changes, we will be forever the poorer for it. But if we ride out the change and continue to look forward, the eventual outcome can be astonishingly good. And I provide, as proof of that fact, the accompanying photo.

The Korumburra Community Hub was officially opened to the community on Friday 10 November. A week of celebrations continued afterwards, enticing residents to come along and enjoy this amazing facility. Our residents can use the new Library, visit Milpara Community House, undertake Centrelink appointments, visit the Korumburra and District Historical Society and have a place for meetings and events.

The Commercial Street Streetscape project is going through a public tender process. Once this is complete, works are set to start during summer. The works include kerb and footpath replacements, new street furniture and landscaping, safety improvements and water main replacements that will be undertaken by South Gippsland Water. This project is really exciting and is set to rejuvenate the main street of Korumburra.

The Korumburra Railway Precinct is coming along really well. Of particular interest is the Railway Building, which is looking absolutely magnificent. A mural is also set to be installed during January and February 2024, with a winning artist being determined through a public voting process.

The Korumburra Showgrounds Changerooms upgrade is progressing. This will provide new facilities to the Korumburra Bena Football Netball Club.

There is plenty happening in Korumburra, and it will be great to see all of these works completed in the coming year or so.
