The Discussion Paper on the future of Coal Creek Community Park and Museum issued by the South Gippsland Shire Council is now in the decision phase. All submissions had to have been lodged by the end of February. The Friends of Coal Creek (FOCC) have made a submission to the Council. This submission represents the community's feelings based on member and community input identified at our open meeting on the 5th of February, which attracted 70 participants. Korumburra and South Gippsland needs Coal Creek to flourish. It is at the gateway to our Shire and one of the main attractions for both residents and visitors.

The Korumburra Senior Citizens Centre in Korumburra was officially opened in April 1961 after the need for a centre was initiated by the Rotary Club in 1959.

At the opening, the Shire President at the time, Cr J. Anderson, stated that more was owed to the Senior Citizens that any other section of the community. He emphasised that it was a place where people of the same age group could care for one another in the way of companionship, and develop friendships.

The committee was congratulated on their work as was the Korumburra Shire Council, for their foresight and generosity in donating the site. The Government of Victoria at the time, also donated £4000 towards the project.

Whilst the Senior Citizens no longer have access to their building in Radovik Street in Korumburra, they continue to meet and socialise regularly. Lunches are held at the Austral Hotel in Korumburra on the first and third Tuesday of each month from midday and a morning coffee is held at the Korumburra Middle Hotel on the last Thursday of each month at 10am.

There are lots of exciting projects taking place in Korumburra this year that will help to improve functionality, increase community connection and enhance aesthetics.

The construction of the Korumburra Streetscape has commenced and will focus on improving pedestrian and driver movement and visual appeal. The works will take place on parts of Commercial Street, Bridge Street and Radovick Street and will include:

- Replacing brick footpaths with concrete ones
- Changing Commercial Street to a single lane of traffic in each direction
- Retained parallel parking with the inclusion of a manoeuvring lane
- New street furniture, garden beds and public amenities


In addition to these works, a mural will be painted on the external wall of 42 Commercial Street by Melanie Caple. The mural was voted on by the community and includes a beautiful floral design featuring native birds.

A newly resurfaced parking area at the rear of the Burra Brewery is now complete

and Council is engaging with Heritage Victoria to secure the necessary permits for work to occur in the Korumburra Railway Precinct area. These works will include installation of a new skate park and improved landscaping. Also planned is a new walkway at 27 Commercial Street. Council recently purchased this space, which was formally home to a newsagency before it was damaged by fire in 2022. The project will provide pedestrian connection between Commercial and Little Commercial Street, which is home to the new Korumburra Hub.

Stay tuned for more updates on these exciting projects for Korumburra.



Korumburra Cemetery surrounds are in good condition thanks to our Caretakers Andrew and Fay Siekman tireless workers mowing, gardening and levelling sites etc. During December some low lights broke into the Cemetery Shed and stole our little Tractor we used to pick up the dead flowers around the Cemetery, we have since installed a remote controlled camera within the Cemetery thanks to Orange Beacon of Korumburra which alerts the Secretary. The new Rose Garden is completed adding an extra fifteen sites thanks to Korumburra Garden Supplies for supporting the Trust with Standard Roses costs and Mulch. We need to add a couple of Vaults also we will be adding some Beam extensions in. The Monumental Garden will be


The Anderson Inlet Stamp club Meet at the Uniting Church in William St on the second Wednesday of each month starting at 1.30pm

We look forward to our planting days later this year!

Grower's Group: This group has been set up in order to support both our own initiatives, such as the Rail Trail project, and to support other local groups with similar revegetation aims. We have many plants propagated by volunteers in our nursery

already, and are currently preparing to propagate more plants for the 2025 season. We will also look at growing plants for sale at local markets, and other possible areas of sale (in consultation with other local community indigenous plant nurseries) to raise funds to support our group.
